

TRU Law awards

Law Foundation of BC (2024/25 school year)

Entrance awards totaling \$50,000 are offered by the Law Foundation of British Columbia to 5 incoming 1L students to the Faculty of Law at TRU. These funds will be disbursed in equal amounts of \$10,000 per recipient. These awards are offered upon recommendation by the Faculty of Law to racialized students who have experienced socio-economic disadvantage as indicated in their JD applications.

Future Black Lawyer Entrance Award \$5,000

Awarded annually to an incoming student enrolled at TRU Law who is Black and has overcome hardship to attend law school. If there are no candidates that fit this description, preference will be given to a Black student enrolled in 2L or 3L based on GPA, and lastly if no candidates fit the preferences, the award will go to an incoming student that belongs to a racialized group, based on GPA.

The Fairborz Khasha Law Award

Awarded to a third-year student enrolled in the JD program who has shown continued improvement in their GPA from first year to second year of the program. Preferences will be given to BIPOC and/or first generation immigrant students and who have experienced financial challenges in order to attend law school. To be considered, please apply using the TRU Law Awards
